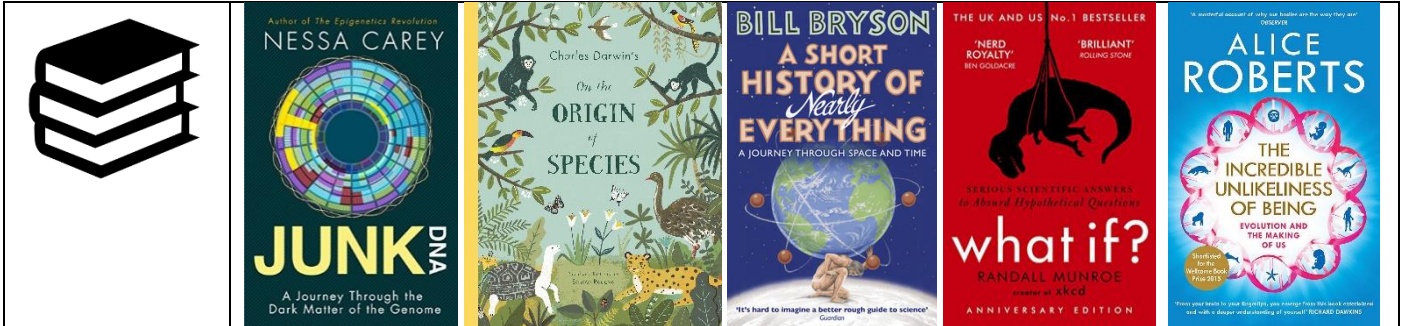


ONCE A **BIOLOGIST**, ALWAYS A **BIOLOGIST**!
